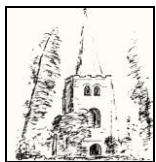

The year seems to have flown past as we now approach December and St Nicholas has a busy month ahead.

**Christingle** - On 5<sup>th</sup> December at 4.00 pm we will be making the Christingle oranges during the service. Christmas trees will be in church as part of our Christmas tree festival.

**Christmas Tree Festival** - On Friday 10th December (6.30 to 8.30 pm) and Saturday 11th December (5.00 to 7.00 pm) we will have our Santa trail round the village. It will start its journey at three schools before moving into the village. The last family to have it will deliver it to the church, arriving in time for the carol service. We hope you will join us.

We have a collection bin in the church where you can leave your old used reading glasses to be recycled. Tools with a Mission is now on hold until the New Year.

The kitchen/toilet project has a shortfall of £10,000 due to increased building costs. We are working hard to overcome this. Plans are underway for a very busy future as we organise Heritage activities and events. We will soon be in a position to submit our request for funding to the Heritage Lottery fund.

We will need volunteers to help in the community garden to clear it and help it to take shape. Some hedging needs to be replaced and this is expected soon from the Woodland Trust.
